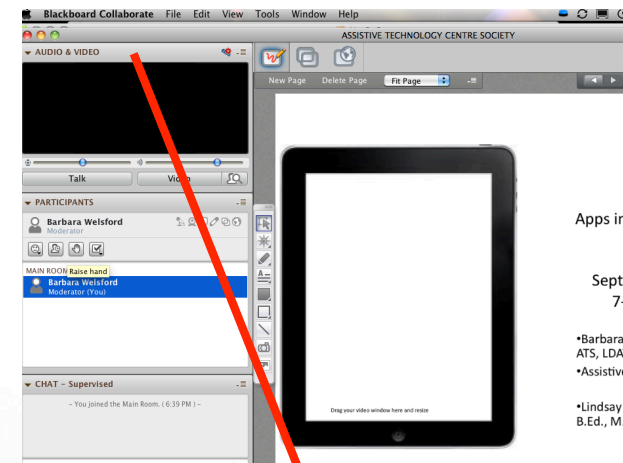

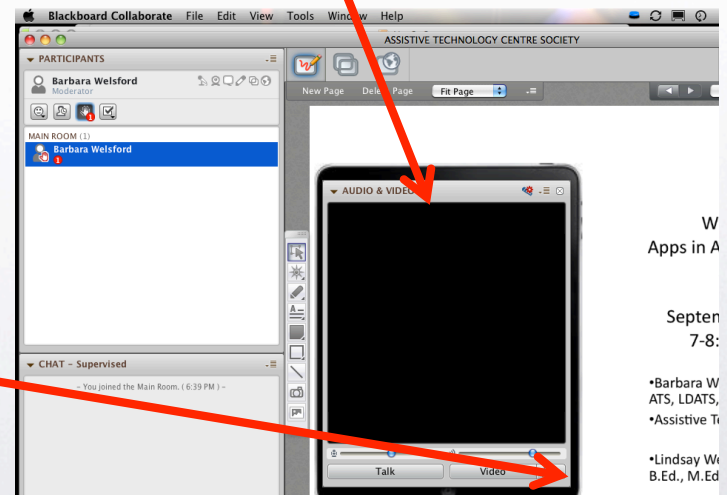
Enlarge your video window

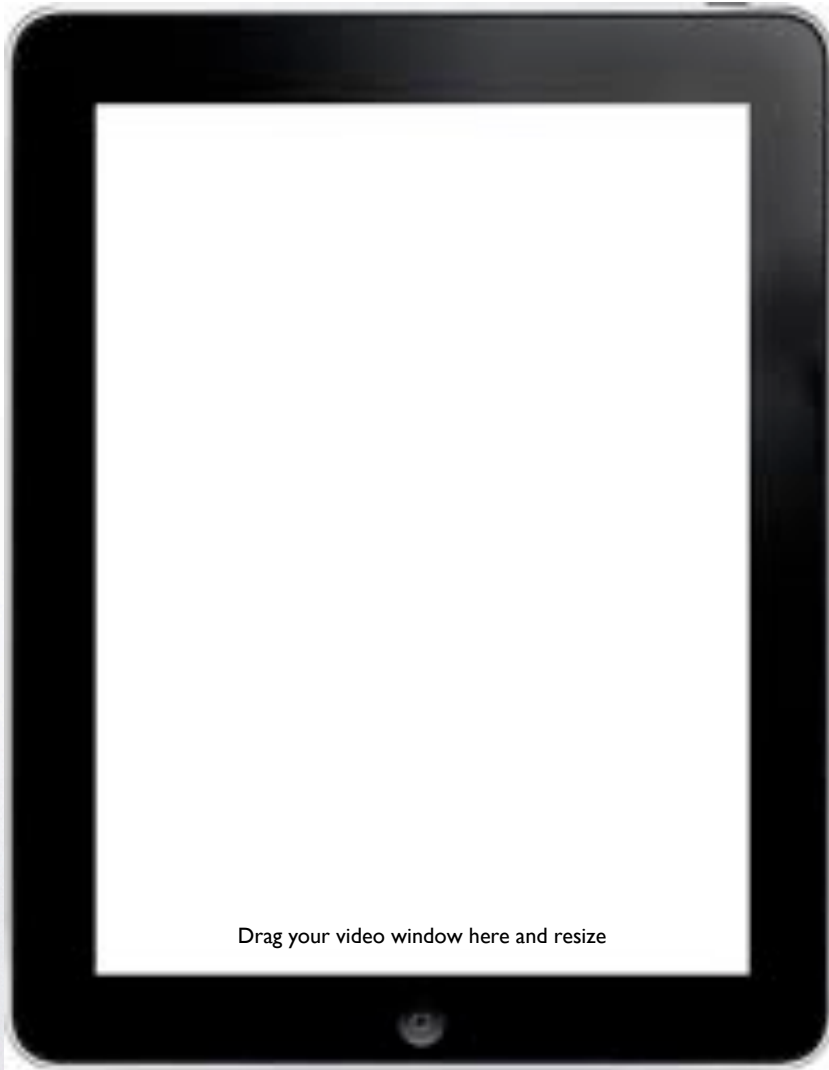


Touch Trainer

- Developed by a Board Certified Behavior Analyst as a way to use errorless learning (in which the learner never fails, but is supported in success) to teach the prerequisite skills needed to benefit from touchscreen technology.
- Allows the learner with autism, down syndrome or other intellectual disability to be in control, and to move forward at their own pace.
- Provides immediate and consistent feedback, allows for practice and repetition of basic skills in a fun way.

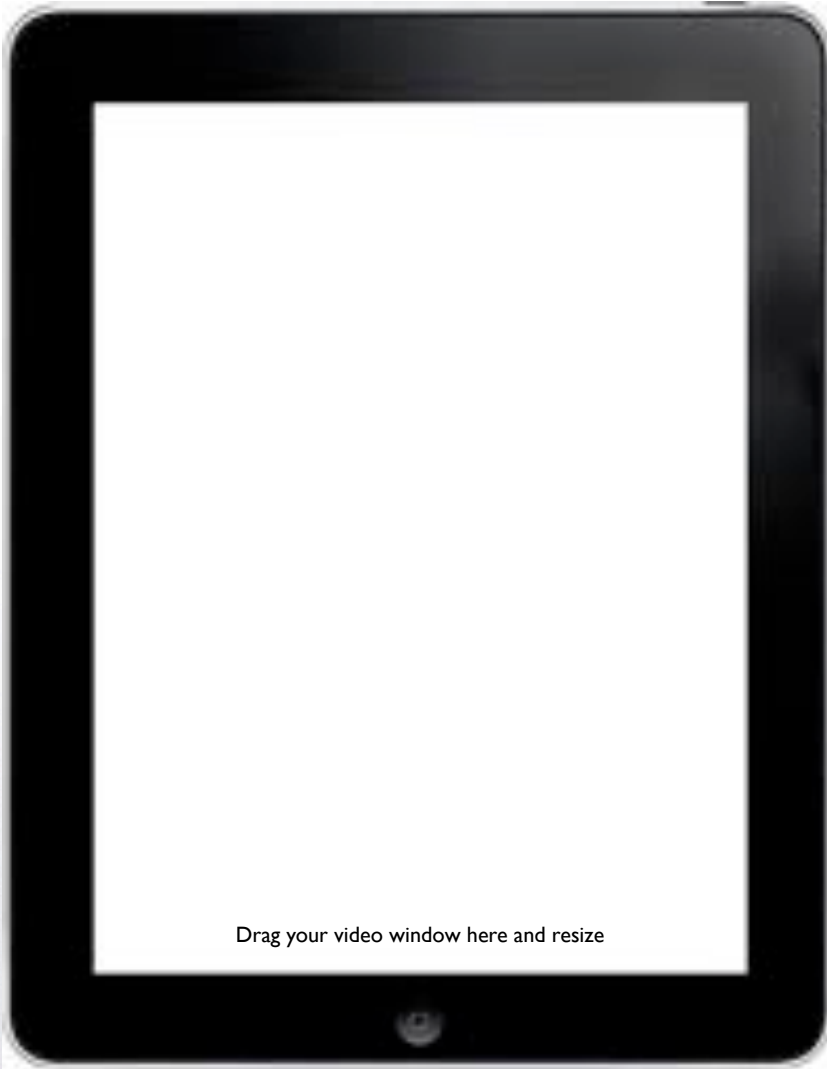

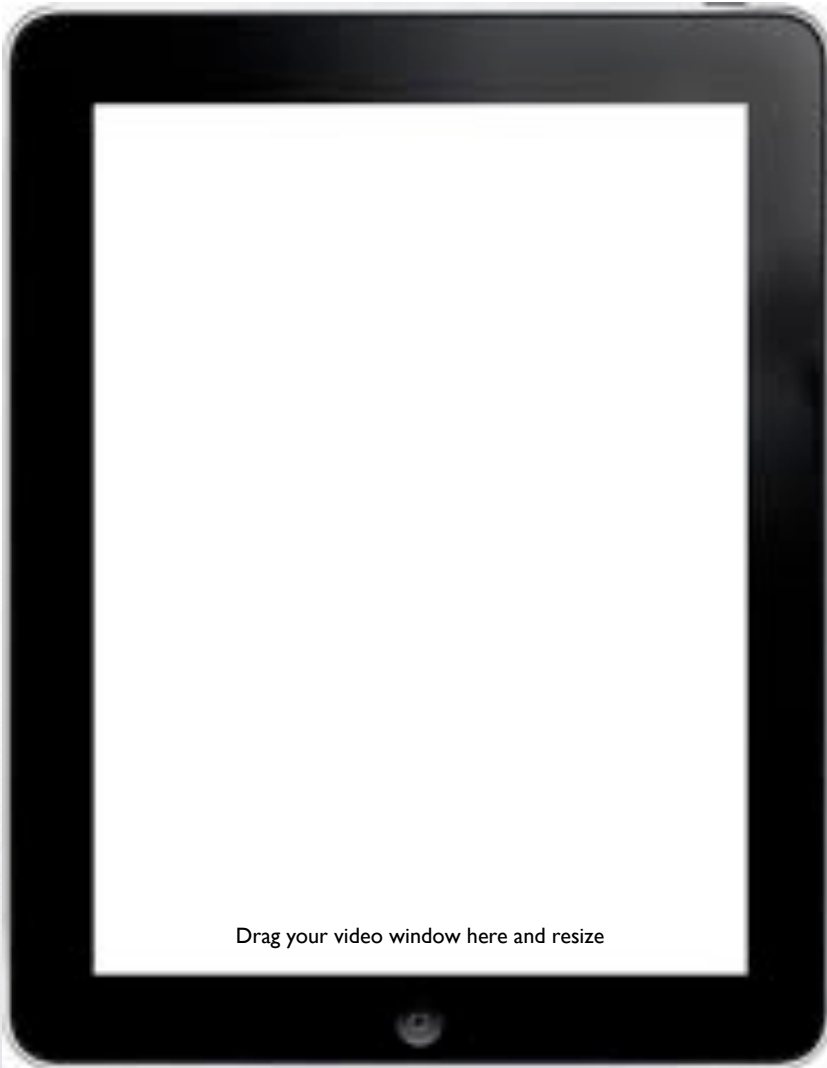
